They have chosen several projects that must be completed by mid-May. They are asking for Rotary Club Members to become Mentors for each project. The projects are as follows:

- Hayfork Park: Replace wood around large playground area, repair existing tables and benches; Repair/resurface basketball court; Raise money and purchase new swings; Skateboard park plans and grants.
- Hayfork Pool: General Maintenance/Winterization; Scrape/prepare walls in changing room and paint; replace curtains for dressing rooms and showers; clean/organize/inventory; fix plumbing
- Hayfork Little League Field: paint & redo roof of dugout; referb snack shack; New banner;
- Hayfork High: Repair/redo/referb Tennis courts; Referb Championship banner
- Hayfork Cemetery: Put up fencing and general maintenance
- Hayfork Rotary Competition: Create and present PPT to HHS & HES (all classes);
- Hayfork Community: Teen Center Mentor; Dance Program

Community Mentor to work with each individual team, guiding the process, but not doing the actual work will be needed

Initial steps need to be completed by February 1, 2010.
